The Board of Directors of the Willow Brook Metropolitan District, Summit County, Colorado, held a regular meeting at The Gate House, 524 Ruby Road Silverthorne, Colorado, on Friday, October 20, 2017 at 3:00 p.m.

Present were the following members of the Board:

Absent was Director Peter Grady, whose absence was excused.

Also present were:

The Chairman stated that proper publication was made to conduct a public hearing on the District's 2018 budget. The Chairman opened the public hearing on the District's proposed 2018 budget. There being no public present to comment on the District's budget, the public hearing was closed.

Thereupon, Director Sherwood introduced and moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION SUMMARIZING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES FOR EACH FUND, ADOPTING A BUDGET, LEVYING GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES FOR THE YEAR 2018 TO HELP DEFRAY THE COSTS OF GOVERNMENT, AND APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY TO THE VARIOUS FUNDS IN THE AMOUNTS AND FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH HEREIN FOR THE WILLOW BROOK METROPOLITAN DISTRICT, SUMMIT COUNTY, COLORADO, FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, 2018, AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF DECEMBER, 2018,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Willow Brook Metropolitan District has authorized its consultants to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body no later than October 15, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been submitted to the Board of Directors of the District for its consideration; and

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published on October 6, 2017 in a newspaper having general circulation within the boundaries of the District, pursuant to statute, said proposed budget was available for inspection by the public at a designated public office, a public hearing was held on October 20, 2017 and interested electors were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, whatever increases may have been made in the expenditures, like increases were added to the revenues or planned to be expended from reserves of fund balances so that the budget remains in balance, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for general operating purposes from property tax revenue is \$199,918; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for capital expenditure purposes from property tax revenue approved by voters or at public hearing is \$139,997; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 valuation for assessment for the District as certified by the County Assessor for Summit County is \$5,447,350; and

WHEREAS, at an election held on the May 8, 2012, the District has eliminated the revenue and expenditure limitations imposed on governmental entities by Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution and Section 29-1-301, C.R.S., as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE WILLOW BROOK METROPOLITAN DISTRICT, SUMMIT COUNTY, COLORADO:

- Section 1. <u>2018 Budget Revenues</u>. That the estimated revenues for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.
- Section 2. <u>2018 Budget Expenditures</u>. That the estimated expenditures for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.
- Section 3. <u>Adoption of Budget for 2018.</u> That the budget as submitted, and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and if amended, then as amended, is hereby approved and adopted by the Board of Directors as the true and accurate budget of the Willow Brook Metropolitan District for calendar year 2018.
- Section 4. <u>Levy of General Property Taxes.</u> That the Board of Directors does hereby certify the levy of general property taxes for collection in 2018 as follows:
- A. <u>Levy for General Operating Fund Expenses</u>. That for the purposes of meeting all general operating expense of the District during the 2018 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 36.7 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2017.
- B. <u>Levy for Contractual Obligations</u>. That for the purposes of meeting contractual obligation expense of the District during the 2018 budget year, as detailed in the following "Certification of Tax Levies," there is hereby levied a tax of 0 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2017.
- C. <u>Levy for Capital Expenditures</u>. That for the purpose of meeting all capital expenditures of the District during the 2018 budget year pursuant to Section 29-1-301(1.2) or 29-1-302(1.5), C.R.S., there is hereby levied a tax of 25.7 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the boundaries of the District for the year 2016.
- Section 5. <u>Property Tax and Fiscal Year Spending Limits</u>. That, being fully informed, the Board finds that the foregoing budget and mill levies do not result in a violation of any applicable property tax or fiscal year spending limitation.
- Section 6. <u>Certification</u>. The District's manager is hereby authorized and directed to certify by December 15, 2017, to the Board of County Commissioners of Summit County, Colorado, the mill levies for the District herein above determined and set, or be authorized and directed to certify to the Board of County Commissioners of Summit County, Colorado, as herein above determined and set, but as recalculated as needed upon receipt of the final certification of valuation from the County Assessor on or about December 10, 2017, in order to comply with any applicable revenue and other budgetary limits or to implement the intent of the

District. That said certification shall be in substantially the form set out and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 7. <u>Appropriations</u>. That the amounts set forth as expenditures and balances remaining, as specifically allocated in the budget attached hereto, are hereby appropriated from the revenue of each fund, to each fund, for the purposes stated and no other.

The foregoing Resolution was seconded by Director Kull.

2018 BUDGET MESSAGE

- 1. The Willow Brook Metropolitan District provides municipal water and road maintenance service to a residential subdivision in unincorporated Summit County. The District has no employees and all operations and administrative functions are contracted.
- 2. The expenditures approved in the 2018 Budget will allow the District to maintain the level of services that it presently provides to its residents.
- 3. The District was authorized by the eligible electors District at its regular election held May 4, 2010 to increase taxes and impose a capital projects limit of \$140,000 per year until 2021 for which a capital projects mill levy may be adjusted up or down to account for reassessments of taxable property valuations for water system improvements. The proceeds from this mill levy are for the costs of water system improvements, repairs, replacements, extensions, additions and acquisitions and other related expenditures.
- 4. At the District's regular election held on May 8, 2012, the eligible electors of the District authorized the increase of property taxes in the amount of \$210,000 annually in 2012 and by that amount plus inflation and local growth in every year thereafter for operations, maintenance and other expenses.
- 5. The District has no outstanding debt.
- 6. The District uses the modified accrual basis of accounting.
- 7. The District completed Phase V of its water line replacement project in during 2017.
- 8. The 2017 water base charge and usage rates are under review for 2018.
- 9. The District certified 36.700 mills in General Fund generating \$199,918 and certified 25.700 mills for Capital Improvements Expenditures generating \$139,997 in property taxes. The Districts assessed valuation is \$5,447,350.
